### Church Women United in Greater Dayton — October 2018





Todd W. Trautwein spoke to our CWU board at the September meeting about the importance of our donating eyeglasses to the Lions Club. It was Helen Keller who challenged the Lions at their national gathering in 1925 to be "Knights of the



Blind in the crusade against darkness." The Lions picked up the challenge and have been working to that end since then. Todd is the current president of the Downtown Dayton Chapter of The Lions Club.

He explained that collected eyeglasses are cleaned, sorted by prescription, packaged, and distributed to those in need, mostly in developing countries, but also in the U.S.A. Eyeglasses from our area are taken to The Ohio State University School of Optometry where students determine the correct prescription of each pair. Last year, the Dayton chapter delivered between 7,000 to 9,000 glasses to Columbus. The Lions Club will accept prescription glasses as well as readers; children's glasses are especially needed. The group also needs your

sunglasses; those don't need to be prescription. Donation boxes are located at optometrists' offices, libraries, schools, community centers, and places of worship. (All Lenscrafter stores and corporate-owned Pearle Vision Centers have boxes.) Need a tax verification for your donation? Just ask at the store. Can you and your friends help someone to better see our wonderful world?

# Church World Service

Churches of many denominations across America helped students in need! They assembled kits that contained identical items and they took them to gathering places across the country. From there, the kits were taken by trucks to one of two national locations in Arkansas or Maryland for distribution to students in need. Our CWU chapter has been a big contributor in this process.

The value of each kit is estimated to be about \$15.00, although some people skilled in coupon-usage and/or back-to-school sales were able to shave a little off the local costs. Each kit requires a \$2.00 fee payable to Church World Services to help with transportation costs.

**QUESTION:** "Why is there a **SUPPORTING** membership option on this year's Membership Card??

ANSWER: Up until several years ago, there was a charge for each celebration because more meals were served — with most of the fee going to the host church, and a small portion going to CWU missions. Since

then, there has not been a charge for ANY of the meetings, with the exception of the Emma Murray Prayer Breakfast. Therefore, CWU has not had that additional income. At this point, the \$5.00 membership does not cover the printing and postal expenses for our newsletters. Further, we are finding more places for our mission funding. We have not increased our support of Mercy Manor for many years. We are asking members to please prayerfully consider support above the basic membership.

#### AREA C / AREA D MEETING WAS A SUCCESS!

Our own CWU-member and Vice-President, Cecelia Long, attended the Area C/D meeting in Hillsboro, Ohio on Friday, September 14, along with Margaret Hunt and Pam Hamby. Ina Green, the State Ecumenical Development Chair, was unable to attend due to family illness. The theme was Diversity and Inclusiveness - based on Galatians 3:28, "Among us you are equal, that is, we are in common relationship with Jesus Christ." The Bible Study was lead by Pastor Mark Stevens; the workshop leaders were Pastor Vicki Burns (currently an Ohio Civil Rights Commission Mediator) and The Rev. Phyllis Clemons, who has written four Christian books. Matthew Stevens from Church World Services spoke, as well. The host church, Cornerstone Assembly of God in Hillsboro, is a prime example of diversity and inclusiveness; the building houses several denominations and worshipers who are African-American, Caucasian, and Asian.

## CWS Kits

Church World Service Kits are small packages of supplies assembled by volunteers and shipped to families and communities in need around the world.

The collection dates are in September, so please begin to collect EARLY in the year!

Save page 5 of this newsletter in a safe place and start YOUR gathering of supplies SOON so that you are ready for next year's early-September collection!

#### **School Kits**

One pair of blunt scissors removed from the package (rounded tip, only)

- Three 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose-leaf or filler paper)
- One 30-centimeter / 12" ruler
- One hand-held pencil sharpener removed from the package
- One large eraser (no pencil cap erasers)
- Six new, unsharpened pencils with erasers, removed from the package
- One box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- One 12"x14" to 14"x17" finished size cotton or lightweight canvas bag (solid color or kid-friendly fabric) with cloth handles (no reusable shopping bags, backpacks, or bags with logos)

All items must be packed inside of the cloth bag. To purchase an affordable bag, visit: www.myshopangel.com.

#### **School Bag Pattern**

Needed: ½ yd. of "child-friendly" fabric / thread **MAKE THE BAG:** 

- Cut two pieces of fabric 13" X 17"
- Place the two pieces together, right sides together, and sew a ½" seam down one side, across the bottom, and up the other side, leaving the top open.
- Turn the bag so the seam is in the inside.
- Turn under  $\frac{1}{2}$ " on the top edge and press.
- Turn under 2" at top edge to form a hem; stitch.

#### MAKE THE HANDLES:

- Cut two pieces of fabric 4" x 22". Fold in half one of the 4" x 22" pieces with right sides together. Stitch with a ½" seam allowance and turn inside out. Alternatively, turn under and press ½" on long sides of fabric. Fold wrong sides together. Top stitch close to edge. Press.
- Repeat for the second handle. Press.
- Turn under raw edges; stitch to the top of bag. Finished bag will be approximately 12" x 14". Place CWS School Kit items in bag.

Canvas tote bags can also be used; they may be available at area craft and discount stores.

## **Church World Service Kits (continued)**



Assemblyline-process worked for putting the kits together at Sulphur Grove United Methodist Church!

Claudia Chapman has been spearheading this project for our Church Women United chapter in 2018-2019.

Here are some highlights from the collection process!

Local churches assembled kits and took them to either Normandy United Methodist Church in Centerville or to Phillipsburg United Methodist Church. From there, our kits were sent to Maryland.

CWS collects three types of kits: School kits, Hygiene Kits, and Cleanup Buckets.



Shipping of the kits to their final destination is expensive. Costs include renting space on trucks, boats, and planes, paying for gas, shipment insurance, and other delivery fees. Donors are asked to upload payment of \$2.00 / kit to help cover these transportation costs.

#### **Hygiene Kits**

- One hand towel measuring approximately 15" x 28" to 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish towel or micro-fiber)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb, removed from the package
- One fingernail or toenail clipper, removed from the package
- One bath-size bar of soap in the wrapper
- One toothbrush in the package
- Ten standard size Band-Aids

All items need to fit inside a one-gallon plastic zipper closure bag. Remove the excess air from the bag and seal before boxing. Do NOT add any extra items or toothpaste. (NOTE: A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each hygiene kit just prior to its final journey.)


