Highlights from our September Board Meeting:



Pam Walker, our CWU Ecumenical Action Chairperson, spoke about "Ration Challenge," which is a program started by Church World Services, a faith-based organization supporting refugees. Co-founders of the Ration Challenge, Kaz McGrath and Ben Littlejohn, started the Ration Challenge in 2014 during a visit to a refugee camp on the Thai-Burma border, where they met with refugees and saw first-hand the rations refugees had to survive on. They were shocked at the meager rations.

The "Ration Challenge" in June 2019 asked Americans to eat the same rations as refugees to increase awareness of the struggles of the refugees. Volunteers signed up to reserve the ration pack which was sent to them. The kit included the same rations as a Syrian refugee living in a camp in Jordan; that included: a small amount of rice, flour, lentils, chickpeas, beans, fish (or alternative for vegetarians and vegans), and oil. Participants could earn extra ingredients to add to the meals by working hard on fundraising by asking

friends, family, and colleagues to sponsor them and raise vital funds for refugees. THE IMPACT? The money raised in the USA (this year \$371,609) provides food for 1905 refugees for one year. It also supports the ongoing work of CWS to help vulnerable people rebuild their lives in safety. Over \$10 million has been raised by over \$1,000 challengers!

Would you like to participate in the Ration Challenge? The Ration Challenge has always been held during World Refugee Week. That week is always around World Refugee Day, which is June 20. The week for Refugee Week in 2020 is June 15 - 21, 2020. Donations are also greatly appreciated! 

World Community Day 2019 focuses on "The time is NOW! Resolve to Love!"

Church Women United offers the invitation to prayerfully approach this celebration with open hearts, willing to leave our comfort zones and become more inclusive communities, living peacefully together.

World Community Day began in 1943 from discussions at a meeting of CWU denominational presidents and executive secretaries, asking that a day be set aside in the fall for the study of peace by church women. Although many denominations were printing their own studies on the new world order, it was determined at this meeting that their unity would be strengthened on one day of united study.



World Community Day continues to emphasize peace, but it has been broadened to include justice, a vital partner of peace. The once-clear categories of "domestic" and "foreign" were consciously blurred so the global scope of the wide range of problems could be emphasized on World Community Day.

A Mission Opportunity: Homefull

Homefull is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization; it was formerly known as "The Other Place" According to Homefull's website (http://www.homefull.org), Homefull assists more than 600 people daily. The Agency's objective is to provide fair and equal opportunity for employment advancement and all other aspects



of the employment relationship in an environment where unlawful discrimination is not permitted. It now provides a comprehensive continuum of services designed to help people find and keep jobs and homes. Homefull provides case management and programming for the gateway shelter system while St. Vincent de Paul provides all the meals and shelter operations. The organizations work closely together. The case managers work one-on-one with clients in the gateway shelters with the primary goal of moving them into appropriate permanent housing, and out of the shelter system. Homefull also provides educational classes for shelter clients, including basic life skills and job search and employability courses. Through its community partnerships with other organizations, Homefull is able to offer additional services such as employment, legal and veterans' assistance, and credit counseling. Homefull is located at 33 w. 1st St., Dayton.


Please help by getting involved:

"A Heart at peace gives life to the body" (Proverbs 14:30)




