

**The Logo:** The idea for the FLC logo came from the late Mrs. Rayann Ma from Hong Kong, the first Chairperson of the first Assembly of the ACWC. The actual design was the gift of her brother-in-law, James Ma, a commercial artist. It is hand, folded in prayer, encircling a small plum flower, and which together form a lotus flower. The Lotus plant grows in the muddy pond, but its flower rises above the murky water and opens beautifully and without blemish.

# President's Message from Cecelia M. Long...



Greetings, Dear Sisters in Christ:

Recently, I was visiting my brother, who had been released from a hospital in the Charlotte, North Carolina area. He shared a story about an experience that he had when he and our cousin Robby had gone to a grocery store. Robby went inside to shop and my brother was in the car waiting for Robby to return. My brother watched a woman use two parking spots to park her car. He could not resist opening his window and telling her that she might be inviting someone to hit her car. She thanked my brother for alerting

her to how badly she had parked. She then said that she had just come from prayer meeting where all of the members had been instructed to pray for someone.

She asked my brother's name and asked if it was alright to pray for him. They did not know each other. She did not know about his health issues, but she prayed for him right there at the car window. Her prayer moved my brother to such a degree that he is still talking about his encounter with her. He knew that she was having a real talk with God on his behalf!

My brother's testimonial was a strong reminder that we must "pray when the spirit says pray!!" We cannot deny that prayer can make a difference. That is one of the main reasons that the Emma Murray Prayer Breakfast has become an annual event for Church Women United in Greater Dayton. The participants were joyful as they saw or heard over 60 people gather for this year's Prayer Breakfast. For this we truly give God the glory!! The Emma Murray Prayer Breakfast speaker, Tierra Hummons gave us a strong message to encourage us to stay "Solid in Christ" as we are facing problems and challenges each day.

During the month of March, women were celebrated in many ways. Among the firsts for Women: Election of Kamala Harris as the First Female Vice President in the USA; Kim Ng is the first woman General Manager of a Major League Baseball Team; Captain Amy Bauernschmidt is the first woman to command an aircraft carrier; Class of 2021 of the U.S. Congress brings more women on both sides of the aisle to the halls of Congress including more women of color; Stephanie Bice is the Iranian-American ever elected to Congress; Susan Collins, Senator since 1997, has become the longest-serving Republican woman in U.S. history; Amanda Gorman is the youngest poet to be at an inauguration; NASA renames headquarters after Mary Jackson, its first African American engineer; Sarah Thomas was the first woman to officiate the Super Bowl.

God is still working with all of us. We are to be the role models for other women. We do not know what God has in store for us. From the biblical accounts of women who stood up and spoke out or acted on behalf of their families, their nations we have learned early on that much comes from women who learn to make a difference for others.

I urge Church Women United to "Rise Up" and stand with women and children and youth.

"Rise Up" and be the faithful people of God. Pray unceasingly! God answers prayers!

## CWU in Ohio Celebrated World Day of Prayer!

On Friday, March 5, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., over 56 women from CWU in Ohio joined together *via* Zoom to pray together. Among those present from our local Dayton unit were Ina Green, Pam Walker, Gail Penney, Martha Shields, Carolyn Joyner, Wilma Blackmon, Rosalee Bradley,

Carolyn Joyner, Wilma Blackmon, Rosalee Bradley, and guest Joyce Green. Through Zoom's Share-a-screen feature, attendees were able to hear the Vanuatu voices singing hymns and we some of the artwork created for this celebration. What a wonderful event this was!



This year's featured country is the Republic of Vanuatu — a country made up of over 80 islands in the south Indian Ocean; previously the New Hebrides, Vanuatu gained political independence in 1980.

Vanuatu's existence is challenged by earthquakes, cyclones, volcanic eruptions, and rising sea levels that cause further erosion. Less than 2% of the land is arable and is used for cattle grazing (instead of vegetable gardens), leading to malnutrition. The literacy rate is about 64%; secondary school enrollment was 35% just six years ago, but plans are now underway to increase those figures by 2030. Although their political Constitution provides for gender equality, there is little will to implement that; no women were elected in 2020. Gender-based violence is prevalent; 60% of women in Vanuatu have experienced physical and/or sexual violence. Access to healthy foods, safe drinking water, and adequate sanitation are concerns; most deaths under the age 5 are due to malnutrition. (Note: Data is taken from https://wdp-usa.org/)

We had a wonderful speaker at this February Board meeting! Amanda Arrington is the Volunteer Services Manager for the Dayton Metro Library. Amanda focused on the Children's Hunger Alliance Meal Pick-Up program for our meeting, but she noted that there are many ways to volunteer — including Rock your Homework and On-line Tutor programs, and more!

For the food program, the library's two partners include Children's Hunger Alliance and Premier ProduceOne, with support by COVID-19 Response Fund for Greater Dayton, The Mathile Family Foundation, The Dayton Metro Library Foundation, Marsh and McLennan Agency, and many individual donors. By the end of 2020, 111 volunteers gave more than 2022 hours to bag and distribute 232,600 meals throughout the eighteen branch libraries.



On the library's website, Amanda speaks highly of volunteers. "Their consistent support, week in and week out, cannot be measured in hours alone. They help us expand our reach by bagging meals for children, indexing genealogy materials, helping students with homework, reading with children, supporting Library staff, and so much more. Volunteers are the core of our community connection, and we are truly thankful for them!"
