

AREA C PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Theme: Living a Legacy of Love: Doing God's Work "JUSTICE AND RIGHTEOUSNESS: FOR THE SACRED EARTH"

Dr. Kathleen Farmer, Old Testament Scholar and Retired Professor from United Theological Seminary led us in a rich Bible Study about God making humankind to take care of the earth and the animals and plants of the earth. Humankind needs to understand that we were not created to have dominion over the plants and animals but that are to be in harmony with the creation to fulfill our role as caretakers.

Pastor Donovan Larkins and Lisa Williams led a discussion about the Shekinah Ranch and the Life School that they offer to equip youth and young adults to become skillful decision makers. Pastor Larkins is a farmer who has been producing hormone and chemical free produce and meat for many years. He encouraged Church Women United to purchase chemical-free produce and meat and to consider growing some of their own vegetables and herbs. Pastor Larkins challenged everyone to encourage young people to become entrepreneurs. It is wonderful to eat healthy products but it is also good to be able to run businesses that sell healthy products.

An offering was collected and given to the Spirit of Life Christian Center for the ongoing work of the Shekinah Ranch and the other ministries.

Pastor Larkins and Ms. Williams gave chemical and hormone free eggs to all who were present, and the remaining eggs were given to the food pantry at Fairview United Methodist Church. Pastor Larkins invited Church Women United in Dayton to come to Shekinah Ranch for a tour and a tea tasting of herbal teas grown on the farm. President Jerri Woods said CWU would have a discussion and get back with him.

The day was filled with powerful lessons for living as God has commanded. For "The Lord God has told us what is right and what is demanded of us. 'See that justice is done, let mercy be your first concern and humbly obey your God.'" Micah 6:8.

Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image according to our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." Genesis 1:26.


CHURCH WORLD SERVICE KITS: ONGOING!


